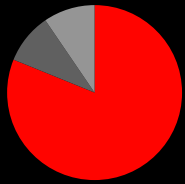

MINNESOTA VOTERS SAY THAT PREDICTION MARKETS ARE GAMBLING – NOT INVESTING



81%

Four-in-five Minnesota voters say that **placing bets on sporting events** through prediction markets is **gambling**.

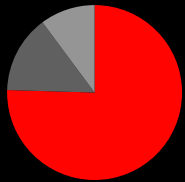
Democrats	80%

Two-in-three Minnesota voters are **concerned** about insider trading **at the expense of the public** on prediction markets.

Democrats	70%
Independents	67%
Republicans	70%

Three-in-four MN voters are **concerned** that prediction markets will **increase gambling related harms for teenagers**.

Democrats	76%
Independents	74%
Republicans	77%
